At this transition time, as Christmas gives way to the New Year, I like the thoughts that Howard Thurman gave us in lines he titled, "The Work of Christmas":

When the song of the angels is stilled,
When the star in the sky is gone
When the kings and princes are home
When the shepherds go back to their friends
The work of Christmas begins:
To find the lost,
To heal the broken,
To feed the hungry,
To release the prisoners,
To rebuild the nations,
To bring peace among peoples,
To make music in the heart.

So now, as we move through and conclude our Christmas festivities, we ask: What will become of the warm and wonderful memories of this season with its messages of Peace and Love? Will 2010 be a time to see how Christ changes us and helps us grow in our faith? Helps us clean house in our own minds and hearts? A message from Presiding Bishop Mark S. Hanson

"But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us..."

~Titus 3:4-5a

Into this shadowed world light shines and joyous voices sing. Glad tidings cheer the heart and liberate hope. "A child has been born for us, a son given to us" (Isaiah 9:6). God our Savior has appeared!

I feel blessed to be a member of this congregation, and look forward next year as we continue to grow in Christ.

Looking Back

Let's take a moment to look back on the Youth and Family events in the beginning of the 2009/2010 school year.

- ❖ The 5th and 6th Grade Youth Group is formed. They meet once a month to serve and participate in Christian fellowship. They've eaten tacos, watched movies, made table decorations for the pie auction, collected six grocery carts of food for the *Reston Interfaith Emergency Food Pantry*,
- ❖ The **7th and 8th Grade Youth Group** travel to watched a movie, ate pizza, participate in the Salvation Army's *Grate Patrol* by helping to make and deliver over 100 sandwiches and sack lunches, gone bowling, attended the *Lutheran Reformation Service* at the National Cathedral.

Turning Silver Into Gold The Campaign for Christ The King Year End Giving

Turning Silver into Gold: The Campaign for Christ the King is our three year stewardship capital campaign that was launched in 2007. Through this effort we are reducing Christ the King's current mortgage debt allowing funds to become available so that we can begin new ministries and improve existing ministries. As good stewards, we are also setting aside 10% (the First Fruits) of all gifts given to the Turning Silver into Gold Campaign for additional benevolence to support mission and outreach efforts outside our Church. We ask that you keep this important endeavor in mind as you consider your end of year giving.

Fulfilling your pledge by the end of the calendar year or otherwise providing a year-end gift to the S2G Campaign not only will provide you with a tax deduction for this year, but will also have a multiplier effect as earlier mortgage reductions means even greater interest savings for the Church and also allows us to distribute those First Fruits earlier putting your benevolence to work sooner rather than later.

Benevolence already distributed from S2G giving continues to "bear fruit." These "seed monies" include funding to:

- launch Stephen Ministry at the Safe Harbor Lutheran Church at Grand Cayman Island;
- support a medical facility run by The CRUDEM Foundation serving one of the world's poorest communities in Haiti;
- assist in the purchase of a church for a mission congregation, the Christus Victor Lutheran Church in Prince William County;
- help purchase land to expand the Lutheran family program of the Lutheran Camping Corporation of Central Pennsylvania; and

- provide facilities additions and renovations at the Caroline Furnace Lutheran Camp.

The total amount pledged to the S2G Campaign is \$632,000, with over \$480,000 given to date. Approximately \$430,000 has been applied as additional principal payments to reduce CTK's mortgage. This reduction in mortgage principal has significant multiplier effects in interest savings over the life of the loan and in shortening the loan pay-off date.
